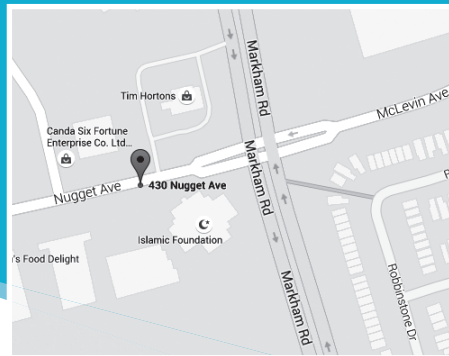

Practical Strategies to Support Young People with Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD)

Conference Description

This workshop will assess and respond to the learning needs of participants, exploring specific ways to integrate FASD-specific support strategies. Moving beyond an introductory discussion of FASD, the facilitators will help participants explore how to rethink treatment approaches and service delivery through an FASD lens and build a toolbox of practical and evidence-based strategies that help youth succeed,

including how to build and implement an external brain. This will include an interview with a woman living with FASD. The workshop is an opportunity to facilitate conversation across the sectors about how to create system change and strong supports for youth with FASD.

Janet Carioni, Occupational Therapist

Janet's current clinical caseload consists primarily of individuals who have sustained traumatic brain injuries or have mental health concerns. Janet is part of the Fetal Alcohol Resource Program in Ottawa.

Tanya Eichler, Private Therapist

Tanya has a private counseling practice where she focuses on individuals and families who have experience trauma including prenatal exposure to drugs and alcohol. Tanya is part of the Fetal Alcohol Resource Program in Ottawa.
